South Sudan is endowed with Wetland Resources;

- 1. Sudd (Ramsar Site since 2006), encompassing three protected areas (Shambe NP, Fanyikang GR and Zeraf Game Reserve)
- 2. Machar Marshes etc.
- ☐ Regionally critical for River Nile Hydrology, regional climate
- ☐ Nationally critical for Biodiversity, livelihoods, water supply, fisheries and other aquatic resources, local micro-climate, nomadic lifestyles etc









South Sudan Wetlands/Sudd Wetland facing many Challenges:

- Encroachment; overgrazing, farming
- Extractive Industries
- ☐ Climate Change
- Jonglei Canal
- ☐ Limited funding from national budget
- ☐ Inadequate Knowledgebase
- □ Inadequate capacity/personnel
- ☐ Frequent Civil Instability; this is changing for better
